Compiled by marketing consultancy Resonance in collaboration with market research company Ipsos, the report ranks cities based on their performance and perception as desirable places to live, work, and visit. Key categories include Livability, which assesses quality of life; Lovability, which measures cultural vibrancy; and Prosperity, which evaluates economic performance. Their methodology combines core statistics from more than 400 global cities and resident and visitor perception indicators like user-generated ratings and reviews.

This Nordic gem prioritizes its residents' well-being, investing in community projects and sustainable infrastructure. With top-notch air quality and extensive cycling paths, Helsinki offers a high quality of life that's hard to beat. No wonder this is the capital of the world's happiest country for the seventh year in a row (according to 2024's World Happiness Report).
